Auckland barrister **Alan Dormer** (TAG Chair) has been an independent resource consent hearing commissioner. He is a past President of the Resource Management Law Association of New Zealand and is on its National Committee. He chaired the Technical Advisory Group appointed in 2008 to provide advice on the Phase One Resource Management reforms, was Chair of the Phase Two Urban Reforms Technical Advisory Group and was a member of the Infrastructure Technical Advisory Group.
