As part of the Wellbeing Budget we are strengthening the Housing First programme to tackle the long-term challenge of chronic homelessness in New Zealand.

What Housing First has achieved so far

Housing First

Housing First is a collective response to homelessness in a community. It offers people immediate access to housing and then wraps around tailored support for as long as needed, to help people remain housed, and address the issues that led to their homelessness.

The Government funds Housing First programmes across New Zealand in Auckland, Christchurch, Tauranga, Hamilton and Rotorua, and is working to establish the programme in several other regions.
