

The Wellbeing Budget 2023 investment is \$419.6 million over four years for military and civilian remuneration increases.

- The defence housing investment will include \$75.4 million capital and \$10.1 million in operating funds for defence housing and the associated infrastructure and project costs including:
 - The Government's commitment to progress the commercial redress partnership in the Ngāti Rangī Claims Settlement Act 2019 to build up to 50 new houses at Waiouru
 - A home improvement pilot for 6 properties in Burnham and 7 properties in Linton and Ohakea
- The \$328 million to upgrading Defence Force assets and infrastructure includes capital and operational funds:
 - \$93.7 million including \$35.5 million in operational funding for Communications upgrades for frigates and Bushmaster protected mobility vehicles
 - \$90.7 million including \$16 million in operational funds for the Ohakea fuels precinct
 - \$59 million including \$2 million in operational funds for the frigates sustainment upgrades
