## **Projects focusing on Māori, Pacific or ethnic communities**

### **Auckland Central Tāmaki Makaurau**

*Age Concern North Shore* - \$2,500 for development of their cultural services by supporting the volunteers that run the programmes and recruiting new volunteers for new programmes with a specific focus on Chinese and ethnic volunteers.

### **Auckland Central Tāmaki Makaurau**

*New Zealand Newcomers Network* - \$20,000 to strengthen the skills of their network co-ordinators, who work with migrant and ethnic people and communities within the regions of New Zealand. The Newcomers Network will create a Volunteer Management Manual and train its co-ordinators to enable them to better support the volunteers in their networks and to have a greater understanding of the needs and motivations of their existing and future volunteers.

### **Auckland Central Tāmaki Makaurau**

*North Shore Community Health Network* – \$13,975 to promote awareness of volunteering and increase meaningful migrant participation in the Aotearoa/New Zealand voluntary sector.

### **Christchurch Central Te Tai Tonga**

*Te Whatumanawa Maoritanga o Rehua Trust* - \$16,328 to maintain the mana and rangitiratanga (sovereignty) of Rehua Marae.

### **East Coast Ikaroa-Rāwhiti**

*Te Aroha Kanarahi Trust* - \$11,197 to train community members who wish to volunteer but need to have an understanding of tikanga and volunteer responsibilities. The leaders from the eight marae of Matakaoa and wider community leaders will assist in the training of new volunteers.

### **Christchurch Central Te Tai Tonga**

*Volunteering Canterbury (on behalf of Network of Volunteer Centres Aotearoa)* - \$16,000 towards the twice yearly meetings of the Network of Volunteer Centres Aotearoa. These meetings provide the Volunteering Centres in New Zealand with support, encouragement, information and resources and share best practice for running Regional Volunteer Centres.
